### A MESSAGE FROM YOUR MP







Davenport friends and neighbours: amis et voisins de Davenport:

Hope and transition.

These are the words that I believe will define 2021. It's been a hard start to the year, and as I write, the unexpectedly strong second wave is finally starting to decline. We are not out of the woods yet, but I hold great hope that 2021 will end up being a much better year than the last one.

We will, though, be changed by this experience—and the opportunity before us is to create a better community and country as we restart our economy and re-emerge post-COVID-19.

Vaccines are top of mind for everyone. Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has indicated that there will be a vaccine available for everyone who wants one by September 2021.

The federal government has spent over \$1 billion on vaccines. We have secured the largest number of vaccine options in the world. Two vaccines by Pfizer and Moderna have been approved by Health Canada and two other promising options are in the queue: AstraZeneca and Johnson & Johnson.

The federal government is working closely with the provinces and territories to make sure they receive the vaccines. Every province and territory is given a clear schedule of how many doses will be sent and when—so that they can distribute it. At time of print, we are expecting 4 million more vaccines by the end of March, and 1 million vaccines each week after that. And if Health Canada approves the AstraZeneca vaccine (expected to happen in early February) then the number of vaccines arriving in Canada will be higher.

It's important to remind ourselves that there are over 7.8 billion people in the world and only a limited number of companies producing approved (i.e. safe) vaccines; so Canada is lucky and privileged to be among

the first countries to receive vaccines.

It will take time to distribute. It is a colossal iob to distribute 37 million vaccines across the country with each province in charge of its own distribution. The federal government buys the vaccines and delivers them to the province—it is up to the province to decide how to best distribute and in what

In the meantime, there are other ways to keep safe until it's time for all of us to be vaccinated. 14 million rapid tests have been sent to provinces and territories, and much more are on the way. The federal government has spent \$7.6 billion to buy two billion items of personal protective equipment and \$3 billion of this has gone directly to the provinces and territories through the Safe Restart Agreement.

I also want to remind everyone that there are not only financial federal supports for Canadians and for small businesses (Canada.ca/coronavirus) but also supports for wellness and mental health. This is such a tough time for each one of us. It's ok not to be ok.

For as long as this pandemic lasts, know that the federal government has your back. Please keep safe Davenport.
